Happy New Year to everyone! Welcome 2025! It was lovely to see everyone back this week having had such fun.

We have added a few new dates for this term so please update your calendars with class assembly dates.

We always take this opportunity to remind you when you are planning the year ahead and your holidays that school attendance is mandatory. If you should be planning any term time absence, this should only be the case if there are exceptional circumstances, of which a family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

Term dates are on <u>our website</u>, where you can also find a printable calendar with term dates. You will also find a copy of the attendance policy and a request for absence form.

You must complete the request for absence document, then we have processes to follow to ensure this information is correctly recorded. This is for two reasons; firstly safeguarding children if they do not arrive at school when they should and secondly schools attendance officers meet with us every half term to discuss attendance figures and may request to see the documentation. Holiday is rarely arranged at short notice so please ensure we have this documentation when you book your holiday. We would always encourage honesty about these situations, please do not ask children to be dishonest about why they are absent or where they have been, it can be profoundly damaging. We are approachable, should you wish to discuss anything about an absence before you book, then do contact me.

Everyone should be aware the <u>government procedures</u> for fines and prosecutions have changed since September 2024 and you should also be aware that holiday time taken over a three-year period is taken into consideration for fines and/or prosecution.

All absence negatively influences children's education and infant age children are no exception to this.






