The School

St John's is an OFSTED 'Outstanding' popular Church of England Infant school. It is a thriving school of approximately 90 pupils located in the heart of the village of Churt, near Farnham.

The school provides an excellent education, delivered through a broad and balanced curriculum, designed to engage, challenge and excite each child.

It offers a wide range of experiences, from Forest School, yoga and mindfulness, to an extensive choice of after school clubs and activities. Including sport, choir, languages, cookery and art. Staff are committed and enthusiastic, with a wealth of experience.

The school is extremely proud of its long-standing record of high academic achievement, and is a feeder school to both Waverley Abbey and South Farnham.

Its facilities include a new purpose built library, outside trim trail, and light and airy classrooms – designed to encourage a love of learning, in a warm, happy and stimulating environment.

From the moment you walk through the doors of St John's you will be greeted by a friendly smile, and you can appreciate why this happy, and thriving school is recognised as one of the leading schools in the area.



About us

Located in the heart of the village of Churt, the school has three classrooms, an extra learning and teaching room, purpose built library, large hall, and kitchen. We also have very well-used outside areas adjoining all classrooms, plus two fields and a playground.

The children are encouraged to think deeply and ask challenging questions about spirituality, awe, wonder and their place in the world. We aim to challenge and support all our children as individuals, instilling in them a genuine love of learning.

School Organisation

Children who will become five during the academic year will be admitted in the Autumn term. The school has three classes: one each for the Reception year (Rabbit Class) and academic years One and Two, (Fox and Badger Classes).

Parent Partnership

Parents are invited to many activities held in the school. There are Parents' Evenings every term when children's work can be seen and progress discussed with their teacher. There are also 'Meet the Teacher' meetings and class assemblies, as well as the Christmas productions, Sports Day, and regular PTA events.



History of the School

St. John's was built in 1870 and opened a year later, as a village elementary school. In 2020, the school will celebrate its 180 year anniversary and long service of providing a Christian education to the children of Churt and surrounding areas.

A school in the community

Churt is a small village with a thriving community spirit. The children are encouraged to take part in village activities from the outset of their school life. The local parish church of St John's has very strong links with the school. At the end of each term a school service is held in the church, which every pupil and staff member attends, and to which parents are also invited. Our local vicar comes and works in school, taking fun-filled assemblies fortnightly.



Aims and Objectives

To provide a school day that excites, challenges and motivates each child in a safe and inspiring environment.

Curriculum

Cultures, values and beliefs are respected and reflected in the curriculum and in the daily life of the school.



Curriculum

We provide quality teaching and learning through a rich, creative, challenging and fun curriculum.

In Reception Class the children follow the Foundation Stage curriculum which gives this very important stage of education a distinct identity.

This covers three prime areas:

- Personal, social and emotional development
- Communication and language
- Physical development

Along with four specific areas of learning:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world
- Expressive arts and design.



Progress in all subjects is closely monitored through formal teacher assessment or standard assessment tests in line with national expectations. The curriculum of St John's is planned to help the children explore a wide variety of experiences, using their imagination and exercising their powers of thinking to make sense of the world around them.

Whilst independence and resilience in learning is encouraged, time is also devoted to fostering collaboration and demonstrating the benefits of team work. Topic and thematic work and focus weeks helps the children develop links between different areas of the curriculum. Learning takes place in both the indoor and outdoor environments.

SEN Information

When a teacher or parent believes a child has a particular learning difficulty, steps are taken to establish what needs to be put in place to support the child's learning. We have a dedicated SENCO to support children families and teachers. For more information the school's SEN Policy is also available on the school website.

Curriculum

Reading

A genuine love of reading is facilitated by giving the children access to a wide range of exciting and attractive books. They are encouraged to read both stories and poems, as well as using books for finding out information. Interest and enjoyment is further fostered by a take home 'shared reading' scheme. In a structured approach, books are chosen to be read with both teachers and parents. We use 'Read Write Inc Phonics' to teach systematic phonics.

Technology & Innovation

Each classroom is equipped with interactive whiteboards, PC's and tablets.

Forestschool

Children are given opportunities to explore our forest in both on and off site locations. The experiences gained cover many curriculum areas; physical development, scientific enquiry, imagination, D.T. As well as focus on improving resilience.

Mathematics

Through carefully planned steps and sequences, children gain knowledge of concepts and a deep understanding of number calculations, shape, space and measure. Children are challenged to explain their mathematical thinking from the earliest ages, allowing them to truly demonstrate their understanding.

Science

Through exploration and discovery science helps children to understand the world around them. Investigations and experimentation develops the skills of observing, measuring, questioning, predicting and communicating.

RE

The Guildford Diocese syllabus is followed to deliver the RE curriculum in weekly lessons. Whilst our Christian values are modelled by every member of our school community.

Sport

From football, tennis and cricket, we currently use outside sports coaches to deliver well planned skills lessons and team games.

Arts - Drama, Music, DI

Children are encouraged to express themselves in a variety of forms and media.
